

GSE's Summer Startup program develops entrepreneurial skills in high school students and qualifies them for college scholarships. GSE's Collegiate Pitch program is Kentucky's largest collegiate pitch competition, offering thousands of dollars in prizes. Program alums have launched more than 70 businesses and filed for multiple patents. Because of strong partnerships with entities like the Kentucky Education and Labor Cabinet and the Cabinet for Economic Development, along with private and public supporters, GSE programs are free for selected student entrepreneurs. HOSTED AT THE GATTON COLLEGE

The University of Kentucky session was held from June 23 to July 13, 2024, at the Gatton College of Business and Economics in Lexington. The first week at the University of Kentucky was a flurry of activities, filled with energy and anticipation. This involved decorating the residence halls and event spaces with vibrant, inspiring themes that reflected the entrepreneurial spirit of the program. The effort paid off, as the Es were greeted with a lively, welcoming environment that set the tone for their exciting journey.

Our Es were thrilled to welcome Governor Andy Beshear to the University of Kentucky Gatton College of Business! Governor Beshear emphasized the importance of fostering Kentucky-grown businesses, and encouraged the Es to keep innovating within their local communities. He spoke about the entrepreneurial spirit that drives Kentucky forward, highlighting the successes of local businesses that started with a simple idea and grew into thriving enterprises. He took questions from the group and visited with teams to learn about their business ideas and provide feedback.

The Governor's encouragement served as a powerful reminder of the impact that up-and-coming entrepreneurs can have on their communities, not just economically, but socially and culturally, too. University of Kentucky Es also ventured to the Frazier History Museum in Louisville and were immersed in Kentucky's rich history and its potential as an entrepreneurial home base. Mick Sullivan from the Frazier team, along with Guest Entrepreneurs David Stadler, Heather Howell, and Dan Ross-Li, shared inspiring stories and practical advice, encouraging the Es to dream big and set ambitious goals. Back on campus, Guest Entrepreneurs Emma Preston, TJ Barnett, Isaac Hamlin, Katarina Midelfort, and Chris Rhodes shared their expertise. Their sessions left these young entrepreneurs motivated and ready to forge their paths in the business world.

The competition is organized and governed by the Governor's School for Entrepreneurs with support from the Kentucky Education and Labor Cabinet and KY Inno.

INNOVATION & ENTREPRENEURSHIP TRAINING CERTIFICATE (INET)

SPRING 2024

When Ethan Jackson decided to pursue the Innovation and Entrepreneurial Thinking (iNET) certificate, he didn't know the long-term impact that the program would have on his professional development. This multidisciplinary, 12-hour certificate, housed in the University of Kentucky College of Communication and Information and offered in partnership with the Gatton College of Business and Economics, provides entrepreneurial educational opportunities and meaningful experiences to help students succeed in an entrepreneurial world.

The iNET certificate requires 12 hours of unique coursework, including COM 381 Communication, Leadership and Entrepreneurship, two electives and an EXP (Experiential Education) Capstone course. The certificate connects students to a network of innovators and entrepreneurial mentors at UK and in the local community.

"I first heard about the iNET Certificate through iNET certificate director Dr. Amanda Lawrence," Jackson said. "Meeting with Dr. Lawrence multiple times throughout the process was incredibly helpful. She was always willing to answer my questions and help me understand what the iNET certificate is all about."

A highlight of the iNET certificate program was the entrepreneurial bootcamp offered through the Von Allmen Center for Entrepreneurship (VACE) in the Gatton College of Business and Economics. The Entrepreneurs Bootcamp is an online business accelerator designed to assess and validate the feasibility of a business concept, create a business model and provide hands-on experience for entrepreneurs seeking to launch a startup for the first time in the state of Kentucky. Certificate students are strongly encouraged to take the EXP 396: Entrepreneurs Bootcamp course as their culminating capstone experience.

RESEARCH POSTER PITCH COMPETITION

SPRING 2024

The 19th Annual Clinical Center for Translational Science (CCTS) Spring Conference was held on April 9, 2024 at the Central Bank Center in downtown Lexington, Kentucky. The Von Allmen Center for Entrepreneurship (VACE) in the Gatton College of Business and Economics hosted its 7th annual 1-minute research poster pitch competition. This year's conference theme is "Dissemination and Implementation across the Translational Spectrum." Hundreds of researchers, clinicians, students, and community members will gather to foster collaborations.

Lexington Mayor Linda Gorton's proclamation recognized the critical role of translational science in bringing new findings and knowledge into use for patient care and population health. While it often takes many years for innovations to be "translated" into use, the UK CCTS works to catalyze that process by providing research infrastructure, funding, and training. As Kentucky's only clinical and translational science program funded by National Institutes of Health, the CCTS helps to ensure that innovations by University of Kentucky researchers can directly impact the health needs of the Commonwealth and beyond as quickly as possible.



This year's CCTS conference focused on "Dissemination and Implementation across the Translational Spectrum" and featured: two keynote speakers, 10 breakout sessions, 63 oral presentations, 312 poster presentations including 11 by students from the Frederick Douglass High School Biomedical Pathways Program, the Von Allmen Center for Entrepreneurship 60-Second Poster Pitch Competition, and Mentor Recognition and Special Recognition Awards.

A grand total of \$2,000 in prize money was awarded to the top 4 winners in the Von Allmen Center for Entrepreneurship's 1-Minute Poster Pitch Competition. A total of 24 participants competed in the poster pitch competition. The winning participants were represented by the Colleges of Medicine, Engineering, and Communication & Information.





5ACROSS PITCH COMPETITION

SPRING & SUMMER 2024

The 5 Across Entrepreneur Pitch Competition brings together aspiring business owners and the local startup community in Lexington, Kentucky. All are encouraged to dress their best and pitch their ideas for the chance to win funding and prizes. 5Across features five Kentucky startups that pitch against each other for an opportunity to win \$5,000 in funding for their business ideas.

Each business pitches to a panel, with panelists voting on the best idea and determining which pitch wins the prize money. The winning entrepreneur will claim \$500 cash and a \$5,000 SAFE note from local bank Keyhorse Capital. 5Across also includes a catered meal for attendees and participating competitors.

The event organized by Awesome Inc., located in downtown Lexington, and gives Lexington residents the opportunity to celebrate local startups and the small business community.

SEC PITCH COMPETITION

FALL 2023

The Fall 2023 SEC Pitch Competition was hosted at the University of Georgia, at the Terry College of Business. The SEC Student Pitch Competition provides a showcase for entrepreneurs, pitting student teams representing each of the 14 Southeastern Conference universities against one another in a startup business pitch competition. Students present their innovative business to a panel of judges to determine those most worthy of a funding investment.

The Von Allmen Center for Entrepreneurship represented the University of Kentucky, with team "Dating Apps Made Better" aka DAMB. The team included founder and University of Kentucky student, William Burroughs. William graduated from the University of Kentucky College of Arts & Sciences with a Bachelors Degree in Biology. He received honorable recognition for participating in the SEC Pitch competition, and completed Bootcamp 1.0 in Fall 2023.





ENTREPRENEURS BOOTCAMP BUSINESS ACCELERATOR

The Entrepreneurs Bootcamp is an online business accelerator designed to assess and validate the feasibility of a business concept, create a business model, and provide hands-on experience for entrepreneurs seeking to launch a startup for the first time in the state of Kentucky.

Who Can Participate

The Entrepreneurs Bootcamp Online Business Accelerator is open for enrollment to Kentucky-based entrepreneurs. This includes:

- Current Students
- Faculty
- Staff
- Post docs/Alumni
- Community Entrepreneurs
- Extension offices

Academic Credit

Currently enrolled University of Kentucky student(s) can register for Bootcamp 1.0 to receive academic credit. Bootcamp is offered through four (4) different elective course codes outlined below. An option to earn a pass/no pass credit in this elective is available to eligible students that successfully complete the program as outlined in this syllabus. Please consider the intensity of an online accelerator prior to registering for academic credit.

- B&E 396 (undergrad) Currently enrolled undergraduate Gatton College of Business students
- B&E 650 (grad) Currently enrolled graduate Gatton College of Business students
- EXP 396 (undergrad) Experiential credit for all undergraduate majors
- EXP 650 (grad) Experiential credit for all graduate majors

Offered Every Semester

The Entrepreneurs Bootcamp is offered every semester:

- Fall Bootcamp 1.0 Monday section, online from 5:00pm-7:00pm EST
- Fall Bootcamp 1.0 Thursday section, online from 4:00pm-6:00pm EST
- Spring Bootcamp 1.0 Monday section, online from 5:00pm-7:00pm EST

Eligibility, Intensity, and Expectations

Bootcamp is time consuming and demanding outside of regular job/class schedules. It is offered in the evenings to mimic the life of an entrepreneur. All participants are held accountable to meet various milestones, schedule zoom/team meetings outside the scheduled sessions, and perform the duties of an acting CEO.

Handbook

All participants in Bootcamp must read the handbook and digitally sign the Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) associated with the accelerator.


